He is also the supervising attorney for his firm's real estate department, overseeing six attorneys performing residential and commercial real estate closings and preparing the firm's real estate newsletter, which is sent to attorneys and clients. Abromitis is a leader in charitable organizations such as the Hackettstown Rotary Club, which raises money for local institutions, and Family Promise of Warren County, Inc., which is dedicated to providing emergency shelter, meals and other support for the homeless in the county. He serves on the board of directors of the Warren County Regional Chamber of Commerce. In addition to extensive pro bono work in the Warren County courts, Abromitis represented the Warren County Bar Association in its suit (dismissed for lack of standing) to compel the county freeholders to undertake and fund courthouse repairs.
